

## THE POLICE "CONTRACT ARREST": A CHALLENGE FOR THE RULE OF LAW

Under the growing trend of "contract arrest" for a ten percent (10%) for debt recovery cases or flat charge for other types of matters. It has been a harvest of "corrupt earnings" from such illegal briefs for a Deputy Commissioner of Police, (DCP) Edwin Okpoziakpo Eloho, head of the cryptography and cybercrime Unit, FCID Area 10, Abuja. One of such several "briefs" he received was from an associate and known fraudster, Kehinde Elliot which led to the "abduction" of a businessman from his offices in the Ikoyi Area of Lagos on the 9<sup>th</sup> March 2021.

For the corrupt DCP Eloho who without first reviewing the related file in the archives of the FCID, Alagbon but for him to identify the victim, as all his criminal associate had was a name, he obtained victim's photos from the data system of the Nigerian Immigration Service (NIS) and then further went about tracking the victim's line for three days prior to the abduction by giving directives to two plain clothes Police Officers, David Atama and Patrick Azu to effect the abduction at about 6pm on the fateful day.

Later that evening, the two officers at about 10.30pm checked into Primal Hotel, located at 46B Isaac John Street, G.R.A Ikeja, Lagos forcing the businessman to pay for two rooms 405 & 505. One of the rooms is a suite where the businessman was kept under watch of one other member of the kidnap team named Chidi, who also was the driver of the vehicle used by the gang of "Police abductors". The other room was occupied by David Atama who even had a "call girl" service for the night. Patrick Azu arranged an alternative accommodation for himself outside of the hotel.

The following day 10<sup>th</sup> of March 2021, they received flight tickets arranged by the fraudster for the businessman and themselves and flew him to Abuja where he was now detained at the FCID Area 10, headquarters till the 11<sup>th</sup> of March where DCP Eloho in the presence of his Second-in-Command and two other officers began his "Kangaroo Investigation" by first asking why are the Police after Kenny Ogbor? If he had bothered to read the file related to the case then he would not have to ask such a senseless question. Moreso for a Deputy Commissioner of Police. But it wasn't a professional Police job, he puts on the Police uniform as a cover for his side hustles and illegal activities.

It is noteworthy that, the fraudster had previously in 2019 engaged another known corrupt Deputy Commissioner of Police, DCP Ahmed Kontangora, then of the Force Criminal Investigation Department FCID, Port Harcourt for the same brief. Ahmed Kontangora was however unsuccessful at his attempted "shakedown" largely because the then Inspector General of Police, (IG) Mohammed Adamu received a petition acknowledged by his office on the 24<sup>th</sup> July 2019 and directed the then Assistant Inspector General of Police (RTD) Muritala Usman Mani of the Force Criminal Investigation Department (FCID), Annexe Alagbon, Lagos to assume investigation. The fraudster and his accomplices went into hiding bidding their time for another fraudulent strike.

The strike came, post retirement of AIG Muritala Usman Mani (Rtd.) The fraudster Kenny Ogbor with the facilitation of the same middleman approached DCP Edwin Eloho who after listening to the background decided to accept the "brief" as he believed that the matter had not been handled properly by Ahmed Kontangora and the prospect of the ten percent (10%) drove him to search for criminal elements in the matter where there was none as he later discovered.

After the release of the businessman and on receiving a petition on the "Contract Arrest" in October 2021, the recently retired (IG) Usman Alkali Baba in order to obtain a prompt report on the matter directed the then Assistant Inspection General of Police (AIG) in charge of Force CID Annexe, Alagbon, Lagos, Usman Belel to supervise the investigation of the abduction and professional misconduct against DCP Edwin O. Eloho as other cases of professional misconducts relating to Eloho had been brought to the attention of the Police High command. The responsibility of the internal investigation fell on the then Commissioner of Police (Anti-Fraud) at FCID Annexe Alagbon, Lagos, Yomi Olademji who sent two the invitations to Eloho which he did not honour. Ironically the report reference CB:700/X/AD.ANNEX/VOL124/85 indicting Eloho was sent to the FCID HQ Area 10 Abuja, where DCP Eloho was able to intercept it and prevent the file reaching the IG's office.

Months later word got to the (IG) that the investigation had been completed and the report was being held from reaching his table. On the 5<sup>th</sup> October 2022 he wrote directives with reference CB: 700/IGPSEC/ABJ/VOL66/191 to DIG Force CID Area 10 to furnish him with the report of the investigation in case reference CB:700/X/AD.ANNEX/VOL124/85 and also for the ACP of the Police Monitoring Unit to conduct a separate investigation.

The Force CID Area 10 Abuja on receiving a request for the file have been playing "cat and mouse" game with the Police Monitoring Unit in order to frustrate efforts at exposing atrocities committed by one of their senior officers. DCP Eloho even got his non Police foot soldiers to intimidate the lawyer handling the matter for the intended prosecution of the fraudster while efforts of scuttle internal investigations is continuing.

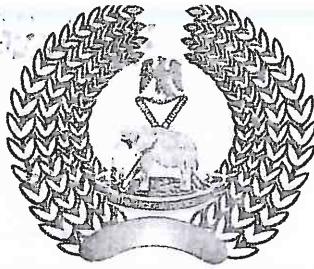



**PETITION OF INTIMIDATION, HARRASSMENT, COERSION AGAINST POLICE ACTION**

The above subject refers

We are Solicitors to Tribler Energy Limited on whose instruction we write this petition.

It is with displeasure that we bring to the attention of your good office the shameful and unprofessional conduct of DCP Ahmed Magaji Kontangora in your Rivers State Command who has departed from the noble duty of law enforcement to a degrading form of debt recovery in a commercial transaction.

Our client, through the Managing Director was invited to Port Harcourt on the 17<sup>th</sup> of July 2019 via a letter dated the 9<sup>th</sup> of July 2019 signed by one Victor Onyeugo.

On Monday 23<sup>rd</sup> of July 2019 after a postponement by the police, our client reported to the station and was confronted with a commercial transaction he was dealing with a company known as Finneke Shipping Limited and a foreign company named Zirconia Marine and Energy International Limited (hereinafter referred to as Zirconia) which serves as a receiving company with its account in the United Kingdom.

Our client has an outstanding balance of \$175,000 in his books as at today after paying off more than 90% of the invoices. The last payment was made in June 2019 with further payment billed for this July 2019 and thereafter.

To the dismay of our client, the complainant was neither the company privy to the contract nor anyone of the directors introduced by the bank, Union Bank UK Plc to our client in the course of the business dealings.

One Kehinde Eliot Ogbor (the Complainant) has falsely alleged that our client is indebted to him to the sum of \$250,000 which he also claims is the same amount owed Zirconia. He claimed to be a director in the company and he is trying to use the police to fraudulently receive money owed a company in his private capacity.

The said complainant did not forward any evidence that he had authority to personally receive the monies. He has also exhibited ignorance in the knowledge of the exact amount owed the company which should have aroused suspicion by the police.

More worrisome about this is that the police under the command of DCP Ahmed Magaji Kontangora are collaborating with Mr Kehinde Eliot Ogbor to receive the money owed a company through an obviously suspicious back door.

We have information that the company neither made any complaint to the police in Port Harcourt nor authorized Mr. Kehinde Eliot Ogbor to collect the outstanding on their behalf. We also state that the company had not given our client any authorization to pay him.

Unfortunately, DCP Ahmed Magaji Kontangora has refused to conduct an investigation of the company to verify the claim of Mr Kehinde Eliot Ogbor and the status of the outstanding by our client.

Sir, the unprofessional and shameful aftermath of this incident is that DCP Ahmed Magaji Kontangora intimidated and harassed our client into signing an undertaking to bring \$20,000.00 (Twenty thousand dollars) CASH to his office to satisfy the purported outstanding to Kehinde Eliot Ogbor who is unknown to our client. This conduct is far below international or even national best practices.

We are particularly at a loss why DCP Ahmed Magaji Kontangora ignored the very important fact that Mr. Kehinde Eliot Ogbor has not produced anything to show that he has the authority to receive funds on behalf of the company. We are also puzzled as to why Kehinde Eliot Ogbor ran to Rivers State to make a complaint instead of Lagos where our client does business and from where he relates with the company.

We are of the view that it is fraudulent for one to use the instrument of the police to receive money that does not belong to him. We believe that DCP Ahmed Magaji Kontangora has fallen to a fraudulent complaint aimed at deceiving him into

obtaining by false pretence money not belonging to a complainant who already has a history with the Economic and Financial Crimes Commission in a similar case.

In view of the above, we urge you to use your good office to investigate the action of DCP Ahmed Magaji Kontangora and the fraudulent complaint of Mr Kehinde Eliot Ogbor leading to the intimidation, harassment and coercion of our Client.



PETITION AGAINST DEPUTY COMMISSIONER OF POLICE FRIDAY O. ELOHOR  
FOR UNPROFESSIONAL CONDUCT, FRAUDULENT CONSPIRACY, GROSS ABUSE  
OF OFFICE AND INFRINGEMENT OF FUNDAMENTAL RIGHT OF MR. JIDE

INTRODUCTION

We act as solicitors to Mr. Jide Alawiye (who is hereinafter referred to as "our client") and on his instructions, we present this Petition. Our client is the Managing Director and Chief Executive Officer of Triber Energy Limited ("Triber"), a company engaged in various oil and gas services businesses including but not limited to the provision of vessels for freighting of petroleum products.

By a letter dated 9<sup>th</sup> July, 2019, our client was invited by the Deputy Commissioner of Police, State Criminal Intelligence and Investigation Department (SCIID), Port Harcourt. On the 17<sup>th</sup> of July, 2019 when our client honoured the said invitation, Deputy Commissioner of Police Ahmed Kotangora confronted our client with a Petition from one Kehinde Eliot Ogor promised on an alleged indebtedness of Triber to him (Kehinde Eliot Ogor). Our client immediately denied any transaction or indebtedness between Triber and Kehinde Eliot Ogor and that he was meeting Kehinde Eliot Ogor for the very first time during the interrogation and offered to give details of the transaction with Finneke Shipping Limited and Kehinde Eliot Ogor's fraudulent intentions and attempt at diversion. Notwithstanding this submission and without consideration for his response to the complaint submitted by Kehinde Eliot Ogor, our client under threat of overnight detention was forced to execute an undertaking to pay up on outstanding to Finneke Shipping Limited and in addition was instructed to bring part cash payment of USD\$20,000.00 on the 24<sup>th</sup> July 2019 to the SCIID, Port Harcourt. After this unfortunate incident, our client instructed his solicitors to write a Petition to the then Inspector General of Police, which Petition was directed to Assistant

prompted the transfer of the Case File from SCID, Port Harcourt to Federal Criminal Investigation Department, Alagbon, Lagos State ("Alagbon") for further review.

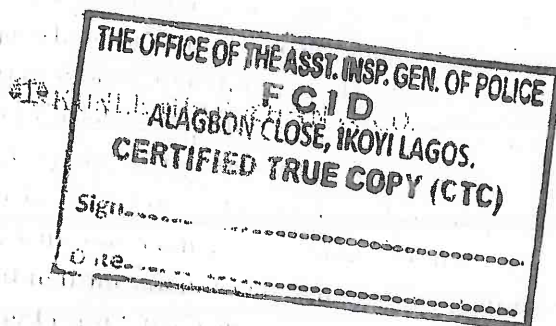
Again, sometime in October, 2019, our client got a call from the Department of State Security ("DSS"), inviting him to their offices in Abuja on an alleged indebtedness of Triber to Kehinde Eliot Ogbor. When our client refused to honour an oral invitation, a formal invitation was extended to our client, five (5) months later in a letter dated 3<sup>rd</sup> March, 2020 mandating him to report to the DSS' offices on the 30<sup>th</sup> of March, 2020. However, due to the National lockdown imposed by the Federal Government, the meeting could not hold.

### MAIN

The latest episode began on Tuesday, 9<sup>th</sup> of March, 2021 at about 5pm when one David Atama, a police officer attached to the Force Criminal Investigation Department, Abuja ("FCID Abuja") visited the premises of our client's offices and informed our client that, he was under arrest in connection with a case involving Ogbor Kehinde Eliot.

Notwithstanding the fact that the matter was already being investigated by Alagbon, the David Atama and another Police Officer, Patrick Azu, drove our client to Alagbon for him to make his statement. Our client was unable to complete his statement as they arrived at Alagbon very late at night. At this point, David placed a phone call to DCP Friday Elohor who ordered our client's detention in a hotel and the retrieval of the case file from Alagbon to Abuja. At this point, it became clear to our client that, there was no investigation or a study of the Case File before effecting his arrest. David then took our client to a hotel and ordered him to pay for two (2) rooms, one for David and the other for our client. Our client complied with David's instruction and paid for the hotel rooms. Patrick Azu declined to be part of this extortion and unprofessional conduct and stayed elsewhere.

On Wednesday, 10<sup>th</sup> of March, 2021, our client, still in custody of David Atama and Patrick Azu, arrived FCID, Abuja where he completed his statement and he was further detained on the orders of DCP Friday Elohor. On Thursday, 11<sup>th</sup> of March, 2021, DCP Elohor started interrogating our client and asked "why are the police after Kehinde Eliot Ogbor?" DCP Friday Elohor also asked why the money owed Kehinde Eliot Ogbor had not been paid to him. Our client explained to DCP Friday Elohor that, his company, Triber entered into a Charter Party Agreement with one Finneke Shipping Limited ("Finneke") wherein it was agreed that, the hire sum due from Triber to Finneke will be paid into Zirconia Marine and Energy International Limited ("Zirconia") account with Union Bank (UK). Our client stated that, his company had completed the said payment as far back as March, 2020 and was not owing Finneke. Our client also stated that, Kehinde Eliot Ogbor's various Petitions and harassment were aimed at diverting the payment meant for Finneke into his personal account without any justification. DCP Elohor directed our client to provide evidence in support of his claim. At this point, Kehinde Eliot Ogbor and one other man, Alhaji Aliyu, entered DCP Elohor's office and displayed an unprofessional familiarity with DCP Elohor. The said Alhaji Aliyu admitted that, he was the one who facilitated and brokered the deal between Kehinde Eliot Ogbor and DCP Elohor which warranted our client's arrest and continued detention.



After telephone communications with Union Bank (UK), a profile of payments that were made to Zircofia's account in settlement of the outstandings was provided and this was forwarded to David Atama's email by our client for DCP Elohor's review. The statement showed the profile of payments of \$170,000 to Finneke Shipping Limited received into the account of Zirconia Marine and Energy International Limited. This fact showed that neither our client nor Triber was owing Finneke, and/or Zirconia Marine and Energy International Limited and certainly did not owe Kehinde Eliot Ogbor. Despite the unwarranted arrest and the fact that the transaction between our client's company, Triber and Finneke is completely civil in nature and there being no evidence of indebtedness to Zirconia or Kehinde Eliot Ogbor, DCP Elohor still refused release our client unconditionally. DCP Elohor directed our client to provide a surety before he would be released. Our client was, therefore, released on bail.

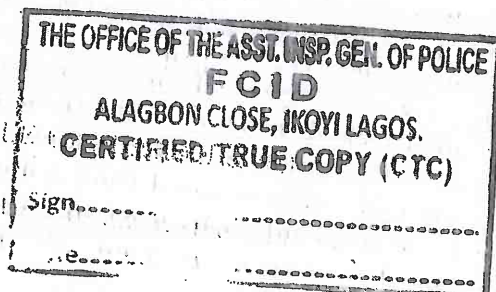
We have our client's instruction to state further as follows:

- i. the order of DCP Elohor for his arrest and detention for the purpose of recovering debt is contrary to the duties of the Nigerian Police as provided under Section 4 of the Police Act, Cap. P19, Laws of the Federation of Nigeria, 2004 (as amended) and Section 8 (2) of the Administration of Criminal Justice Act, 2015;
- ii. the order of DCP Elohor for his arrest on a purely civil transaction is unlawful and illegal as decided by the Supreme Court in the case of *Diamond Bank Plc vs. Opara* (2018) 7 NWLR (Pt. 1617) 92 at 115 wherein Bage, J.S.C., held as follows:

"The subsequent actions of reporting to the police and to the 3<sup>rd</sup> respondent were nothing but abuse of process of law. What is even more disturbing in recent times is the way and manner the Police and some security agencies, rather than focus squarely on their statutory functions of investigation, prevention and prosecuting crimes, allow themselves to be used by overzealous and/or unscrupulous characters for recovery of debts arising from simple contracts, loans or purely civil transactions. Our security agencies, particularly the Police, must know that the citizenry's confidence in them ought to first be ensured by the agencies themselves by jealously guarding the integrity of the uniform and powers conferred on them."

See also the case of *Iheanacho vs. N. P. F.* (2017) 12 NWLR (Pt. 1580) 424 at 461.

- iii. the instruction of DCP Elohor that he be detained in a hotel which our client paid for is illegal and unlawful and, contrary to the provision of Regulation 341 of the Nigerian Police Regulation, Cap. P19, Laws of the Federation of Nigeria, 2004 (as amended)
- iv. his arrest and detention in Lagos and in Abuja without any iota of investigation is contrary to the duties of the Nigeria Police under Section 4 of the Police Act, Cap. P19, Laws of the Federation of Nigeria, 2004 (as amended);



- v. his conditional release (bail with a surety) notwithstanding the fact that, he provided statement of account showing that neither Triber nor himself was owing Ogbor Kehinde Eliot or Zirconia Marine and Energy International Limited is an abuse of power;
- vi. the apparent unholy alliance between DCP Elohor and Ogbor Kehinde Eliot which led to the ugly ordeal of his unlawful arrest and detention is contrary to Regulation 353 of the Nigerian Police Regulation, Cap. P19, Laws of the Federation of Nigeria, 2004 (as amended); and
- vii. the actions of DCP Elohor detailed above amounts to gross abuse of office.


**OUR PRAYERS**

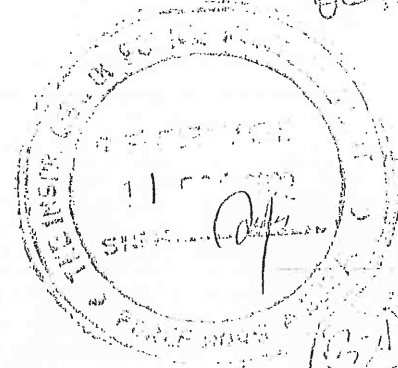



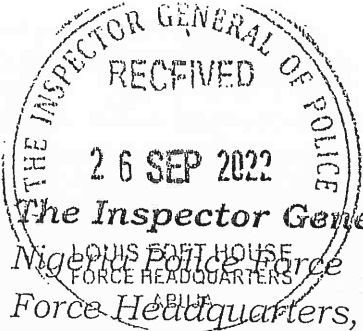
